



Medallists seek even higher skills

WINTHROP cabinetmaker Daniel Johnson and Leeming chef Wei Wei Chuah will put their skills to the test against the best in the business when they compete in the national WorldSkills competition in Brisbane in May.

The team of more than 50 members was selected from 103 medal winners who excelled in the competition at a State level.

"This is the biggest contingent from WA to be put under the national WorldSkills spotlight," Minister for Training Peter Collier said.

The medallists will have the chance to represent Australia at the 2011 International WorldSkills competition in London.

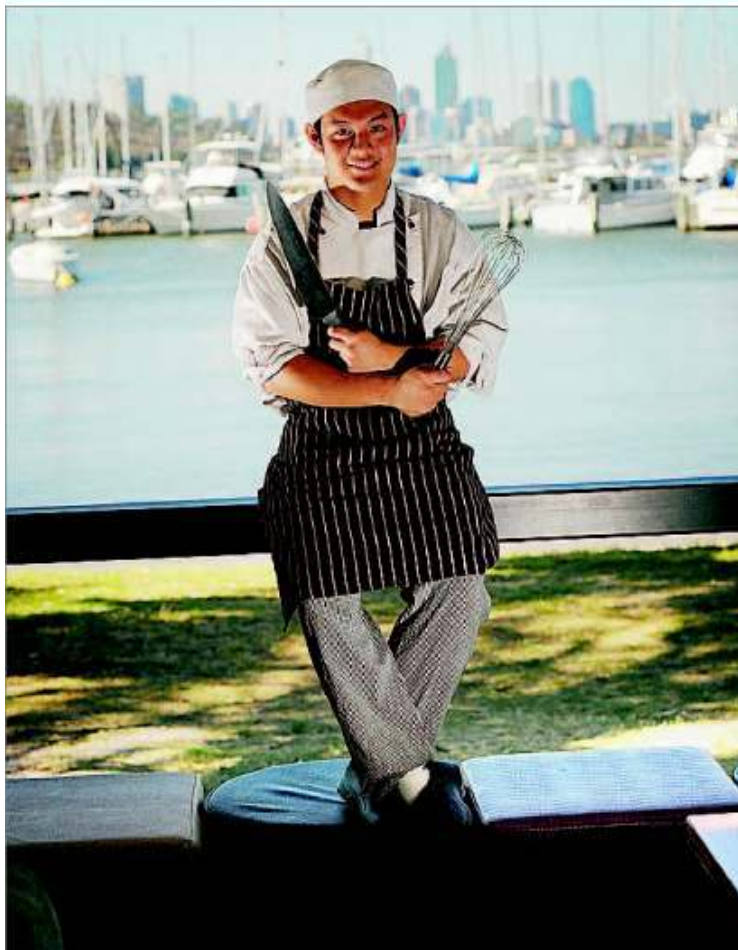
Mr Chuah, who has competed in the event before, said he was looking forward to the ex-
